Nebinger Elementary School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

<u>Nebinger Elementary School</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

Nebinger School currently has a School Advisory Council and an active Home & School
Advisory, which serves to involve parents in the school improvement and action planning
process. These meetings are held once a month.

Section B: ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

- Nebinger's Back to School Night will be held on September 12, 2018. The policies will be reviewed, and the plans for the upcoming school year will be formulated.
- In addition, there are monthly community partner meetings organized by Friends of Nebinger.
- Home and School Parent board has been invited on 4/25/2018 to have input on the Parent and Family Engagement Policy and Parent Compact. They will be invited annually in March/April for yearly input.

- 3) SAC, HSA and Friends of Nebinger are other stakeholder meetings are held at least once each report card period during the school year.
- 4) Interim reports will be sent home midway through each marking period; they will detail a student's individualized progress and identifies their achievement data. We also keep data

binders to track progress, I.E.P. meetings, RTII meetings, parent like and parent seminars to help parents understand achievement data and its importance.

 - The principal will hold a bi-monthly "Coffee with the Principal" Family Workshops
 - Every second Friday of every month, workshops will be provided on academic achievement standards, assessments, Parent Portal for parents to monitor their child's progress.
 - Parental workshops for reading and math will be held each report period during report card conferences.
 - Back to School Night meetings and special events will be used to disseminate information to parents and the community.
 - Communication folders are sent home daily and communications via DOJO
 - HSA website and weekly newsletters
 - Interim reports will be sent to parents in the middle of every report card period.
 - Nebinger school staff will share resources at each report card conference.
 - A Science Fair competition will be held for grades 2-8 in May/June
 - Kindergarten Transition Meetup Night will be held in correlation with Meet and Greet events.
 - Middle School Transition Meetup Night will be held in correlation with Meet and Greet events.
 - Parents will also be given access to individual student data via SchoolNet passwords and other online resources.

Section H: BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

<u>Nebinger Elementary School</u> will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:

• Grade Group meetings will be held weekly. Teachers will discuss strategies and next steps to ensure student achievement

• During half-day professional development days, instructional and non-instructional staff is provided training in the many strategies that can be used in working with parents/guardians. Title I survey results will be shared during Professional Development ½ day in May 2019.

<u>Nebinger Elementary School</u> will provide other reasonable support for parent and family engagement activities under Section 1116 as parents may request by:
